

Conditions of entry (Continued) Maize for Animal Feeds

2. The consignment should be covered by following certifications:
 - 2.1 A Phytosanitary certificate (model of International Plant Protection Convention) issued within 14 days prior to dispatch and issued by a duly authorized officer of the official National Plant Protection Organization of the country of export. It should contain declarations:
 - i. On botanical names of the seeds including varieties and hybrids,
 - ii. On the place and country of origin of the seeds
 - 2.2 Certificate of origin issued by the chamber of commerce of country of export.
 - 2.3 Packing list and bill of lading
3. Certificate from Authorized organization to confirm that the consignment of Maize is not produced from genetically modified seeds.
4. On the arrival of the consignment at the port of entry, the importer must inform the details of the import to Plant quarantine officer at the port of entry.
5. At the port of entry, the consignment shall be inspected by a Plant quarantine Officer and if any dangerous pest, disease or weed is found associated with the seeds, the consignment shall be subjected to treatment or other suitable disposal.
6. Seeds imported are only for processing. They should not be used for planting.
7. After arrival, the consignment should be directly transferred to the silo from the port under the supervision of plant quarantine officer.
